

design a national book token competition 2024



National Book Tokens' annual DESIGN A NATIONAL BOOK TOKEN competition is back, inviting children of all ages to get creative and share their love for books and reading by designing their own fabulous gift cards!

This year's theme is 'Read Your Way'. Every reader is different, and there's no right or wrong way to enjoy reading. Encourage children to think about what reading looks like for them and what it can look like for others.

To enter, children should design a National Book Tokens gift card with this theme in mind — and thinking about what might make someone want to buy their gift card if it was on display in a real shop. A panel of judges will select a winner and runner-up in each of three age categories: **up to 8 years**, **9-12 years** and **13-16 years**.

HOW TO ENTER All entries should be produced on A4 paper using the template sent home with the children (7.3.24). Please ensure you provide the child's name and age, and your contact details, on the back of the form.

FIRST PRIZE in each age range wins:

- £350/€400 National Book Tokens for the school
- £100/€115 National Book Tokens for the pupil

SECOND PRIZE in each age range wins:

- £200/€230 National Book Tokens for the school
- £50 /€60 National Book Tokens for the pupil

Please hand your child's entries into the school office by 29th March (last day of term)

Leighton Buzzard Library

Following a very successful pilot, Leighton Buzzard Library are currently running a literacy programme (Paws To Read).

'Paws To Read' is aimed at primary school age children who are reluctant or struggling to read. The children are encouraged to choose books and share them with our Therapy Dogs. Children who have already attended have shown increased confidence, interest and ability in reading as well as increased confidence around dogs.

In Leighton Buzzard library they have their volunteer Jackie and her dog assistant Callie who have been assessed and trained by Therapy Dogs Nationwide to provide this service.


From April there will be 2 Paws To Read opportunities available after school at Leighton Buzzard Library:

Tuesdays, from 16th April to 21st May inclusive, will be a weekly course, lasting half a term. This course is suitable for students aged between 7 and 11 years. They will be asking for parents to sign up for their children to complete the six weeks. Slots will be slightly longer than those in the drop in events on Wednesdays, providing a more intensive experience. After six weeks a discussion will be held with parents/carers to establish whether it may be appropriate for children to continue by signing up for the next course, to move onto the flexible Wednesday opportunities or to discontinue altogether.

Wednesdays, from 17th April and ongoing, will be a weekly event which parents sign up their children to from week to week. This is a more flexible opportunity which may involve different children each week and may better suit some families who are unable to commit to the full 6 weeks. This service is aimed at students between 6 and 10 years. Slots will be slightly shorter than those on the Tuesday course and sessions will continue throughout the year, with the exception of Jackie and Callie's holidays which will be notified to parents.

Parents must sign up at the help desk in Leighton Buzzard Library.

Both opportunities have very limited places available and we would encourage parents to request places as soon as possible.
